


On behalf of the Arkansas Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration, and the City of Arkadelphia, thank you for participating in this public meeting for project 070442, Arkadelphia Bypass, in Clark County.



This is a brief presentation for the proposed plans to extend the Arkadelphia Bypass' eastern terminus on North 10<sup>th</sup> Street, also known as Highway 67, from Pine Street to Henderson Street in Arkadelphia.


We will begin with the overview and the purpose of the project, followed by the date of the public meeting, and end by outlining the methods available to contact the project team concerning this project. This is a listen-only presentation.



The image you see on your screen shows the Selected Alternative for the entire Arkadelphia Bypass. This route between Highway 67 at Pine Street and Highway 51 was selected in 2021.

The purpose of the bypass project is to improve safety, mobility, and connectivity in Arkadelphia by providing:


- An alternate route to reduce the number of logging and other heavy-duty trucks traveling through the central business district.
- A more direct east-west travel route for both local and through traffic.
- I-30/Hwy. 51 interchange modifications to reduce traffic congestion and increase emergency vehicle access to and from the Baptist Health Medical Center.



As of June 2022, final design of the approved alignment for the Arkadelphia Bypass is nearing completion.

Property acquisition is underway.

Utility relocations and bypass construction are anticipated to begin by the end of 2022. Please note, this schedule is preliminary and subject to change.




Following approval of the Selected Alternative in 2021, Clark County requested that the Arkadelphia Bypass be extended another three blocks north on 10<sup>th</sup> Street, between Pine Street and Henderson Street.




This design modification to widen the roadway to three lanes will improve both congestion and safety on this section of highway.

It will continue the three-lane bypass to just north of Henderson Street, which is an existing three-lane roadway. This will eliminate a potential two-lane "pinch point" between Pine and Henderson streets.

Clark County has coordinated with Ouachita Baptist University and Henderson State University, and the universities have agreed to donate the necessary right of way to accomplish this improvement.



The typical section for North 10<sup>th</sup> Street between Pine Street and one block north to Hickory consists of two 12-foot-wide travel lanes and a middle 12-foot-wide turn lane, with curb and gutter, 5-foot-wide sidewalks, and sod between the roadway and sidewalks.




The typical section for North 10<sup>th</sup> Street between Hickory Street and Henderson Street also consists of two 12-foot-wide travel lanes and a middle 12-foot-wide turn lane with curb and gutter and sidewalks. The primary difference from the previous typical section is the existing curb and sidewalk on the west side of the street will be retained.




There will be a live in-person meeting public meeting on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, from 4 to 7 p.m.

Comment forms will be available and accepted at the meeting.




Project information will be available on the project website from Sunday, July 24 through Wednesday, August 17, 2022. Comment forms will be available and accepted during this time.
